EXECUTIVE ORDER

A Proclamation for "Minnesota Serbian Day"

- WHEREAS, as Minnesota approaches her centennial year, her citizens look back with gratitude upon the contributions to her growth and progress made by people who came from many foreign lands to this new state in the search for freedom and opportunity; and
- WHEREAS, Americans of Serbian descent have given their full share in the development of science, religion, literature, art, the arts and industry, both in Minnesota and in the nation; and
- WHEREAS, because of their contribution to Minnesota's emergence as a wonderful place in which to work and live, it is fitting that a day be set aside to honor Minnesotans of Serbian descent;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, August 5, 1957 as


MINNESOTA SERBIAN DAY


and ask that all Minnesotans reserve this day to honor our past and present citizens of Serbian descent.
