

A Proclamation for the Golden Anniversary of the U. S. Air Force

WHEREAS, on August 1, 1907 there was established in the Office of the Chief Signal Officer of the Army an Aerautical Division, the forerunner of today's Air Forces; and

WHEREAS, since that inauspicious beginning, the Air Force has developed and grown until it is now the guardian of our defenses through air power and a pioneer in research for greater and more efficient uses of our power in the sky; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota's sons and daughters have distinguished themselves through service in the Air Force and have won honors in World War I and World War II and as well as officers of high position and leadership; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota is fortunate in having two Air Defense groups - at Duluth and in Minneapolis - to protect this state from unexpected enemy attack and to train Minnesotans in the art of air defense; and

WHEREAS, the Air Force Association is sponsoring an Anniversary Celebration, designed to bring to the attention of all our citizens the contributions being made in peace and war by the United States Air Force;




U. S. AIR FORCE GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY WEEK
