A PROCLAMATION FOR "UNITED NATIONS DAY" 1957

WHEREAS, the United States of America, as one of the founders of the United Nations, is devoted to the aims of peace based upon freedom and justice, as expressed in the United Nations Charter, and

WHEREAS, the United Nations has succeeded in preventing upon conflict through its provisions for negotiation and conciliation, and

WHEREAS, the United Nations, through its specialized agencies, has worked toward the betterment of the living conditions of the peoples of the world, and

WHEREAS, the United States believes that the United Nations will continue to increase its effectiveness in promoting and maintaining world peace, and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly of the United Nations has resolved that October 24, 1957, the anniversary of the activation of the United Nations Charter, should be dedicated to recognition of United Nations purposes and accomplishments;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim October 24, 1957 as

UNITED NATIONS DAY

in Minnesota and do urge all citizens of the state to observe this day by means of community programs as a demonstration of support for the United Nations.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-ninth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven and of the state, the ninety-ninth.
