
NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim October 27, 1957 as


PULASKI DAY

in Minnesota and do urge citizens of Minnesota to accord respect to General Pulaski as one of our great American heroes.


