A PROCLAMATION FOR "APPRECIATION OF THE FOREIGN BORN DAY" 1957

WHEREAS, the United States is dedicated to the concepts of liberty and equality, and
WHEREAS, this dedication drew to our country's great numbers of freedom-seeking people from all parts of the world, and
WHEREAS, these peoples enriched our cultural heritage and enhanced our material welfare with their contributions of ideas and labor, and it is fitting and proper that we be ever-mindful of the heritage left by foreign-born settlers in our state; and
WHEREAS, the Minnesota Committee for Protection of Foreign Born has passed a resolution suggesting that October 28, 1957, the anniversary of the raising of the Statue of Liberty in New York Harbor, "Appreciation of the Foreign Born Day,"

WHEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim October 28, 1957 as


Appreciation of the Foreign Born Day

and do urge all Minnesotans toward greater awareness of the contributions to our society made by our foreign-born citizens.


