A PROCLAMATION FOR CONSTITUTION DAY

WHEREAS, the story of the writing, signing and adoption of the Constitution of the United States of America constitutes one of the outstandingly important chapters in the history of our country, and

WHEREAS, it is fitting that the wisdom and skill of the fathers of our country in framing this document be brought to the attention of all United States citizens, and

WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States in a joint resolution approved August 2, 1956, requested the president to set aside the week beginning September 17 of each year as Constitution Week;

NOW THEREFORE I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim September 17, 1957, as

CONSTITUTION DAY

in Minnesota and do hereby urge all citizens to join in appropriate observance of this occasion.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed this twelfth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven and of the state, the ninety-ninth.
