AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING TERRITORY
ABUTTING ON THE VILLAGE OF
FLOODWOOD

The Village Council of the Village of Floodwood, does ordain as follows:

Section 1: The Council of the Village of Floodwood hereby determines and finds that the land hereinafter described and included in a petition filed with the Clerk asking that said property therein described be annexed to the Village of Floodwood; that such property is platted and does not exceed Two Hundred (200) acres; that it abuts on the Village of Floodwood; that it is not included in any other village, city or borough and that a majority of all of the owners of said premises have signed the petition for annexation.

The Village Council further determines and finds that the area in the territory described in said petition is of such physical characteristics, terrain and formation that it readily lends itself to municipal development as part of the community of Floodwood and is so conditioned as properly to be subjected to Village government.

Section 2: That on the 14th day of August, 1956 at 8 o'clock P.M. in the Village Hall in Floodwood, Minnesota, the Council held a hearing on proposed annexation after notice thereof had been properly posted for at least Thirty (30) days as required by law.

The Village Council of Floodwood further determines and finds that said annexation will be to the best interests of the Village of Floodwood and the territory described in said petition.

Section 3: The Village Council of Floodwood, Minnesota, on the basis of the findings and determinations therein made hereby annexes and declares that the hereinafter described premises to be annexed to the Village of Floodwood, which premises consists of a tract of land situated in the County of St. Louis, State of Minnesota, described as follows to wit:

Lot "A" and Blocks, Thirty Seven (37), Thirty Eight (38), Thirty Nine (39), Forty (40), Fifty (50) and Fifty One (51), in the Savannah Addition of Floodwood according to the plat thereof on file and of record in the office of the Register of Deeds in and for said County.

**Ordinance Confirming, Ratifying
and Approving Annexation of
Certain Lands by the Village
of Maple Plain**

ORDINANCE NO. 6

**AN ORDINANCE CONFIRMING,
RATIFYING AND APPROV-
ING ANNEXATION OF CER-
TAIN LAND BY THE VIL-
LAGE OF MAPLE PLAIN.**

WHEREAS, under date of Sep-
tember 5, 1956, the Village Coun-
cil of the Village of Maple Plain
received, filed and entered by
reference on its Council minutes,
a petition signed by all of the
owners of and requesting annexa-
tion of the following described
premises situated and being in
the County of Hennepin, State of
Minnesota, viz:

The South 17½ acres of the
Northeast Quarter of the
Southwest Quarter (NE¼ of
SW¼), Section Twenty-four
(24), Township One Hundred
Eighteen (118), Range Twen-
ty-four (24), and

WHEREAS, under date of Octo-
ber 10, 1956, and subsequent to
investigation as to the feasibility
of said annexation, Ordinance No.
49 was unanimously passed by the
Village Council of Maple Plain
annexing the above-described
premises to said Village of Maple
Plain, and

WHEREAS, said Ordinance No.
49 was thereafter and on October
26, 1956, duly published in the
Mankato Herald, the legal
newspaper for said Village of
Maple Plain, and

WHEREAS, a certified copy of
said Ordinance No. 49, together
with a properly executed Clerk's
certificate attached thereto was
duly filed on October 26, 1956, in
the respective offices of the Sec-
retary of State, State of Minneso-
ta, and County Auditor, Hennepin
County, Minnesota, and

WHEREAS, under date of Sep-
tember 24, 1956, a petition duly
signed by certain voters of the
Township of Independence, Hen-
nepin County, Minnesota, was
filed with the Board of County
Commissioners of said Hennepin
County requesting an election rela-
tive to said Township being in-
corporated as a Village, and

WHEREAS, by resolution pass-
ed October 2, 1956, the Board of
County Commissioners of Henne-
pin County, Minnesota, set No-
vember 1, 1956, as the date for
said election in said Independence
Township, and

WHEREAS, under date of No-
vember 1, 1956, an election was
duly held in Independence Town-
ship at which election a majority
of its voters voted to incorporate
as a Village, and

WHEREAS, the former Town-
ship of Independence is now duly
incorporated and functions as the
Village of Independence, and
WHEREAS, it is the desire of

corporated as a village, and
WHEREAS, by resolution passed October 2, 1956, the Board of County Commissioners of Hennepin County, Minnesota, set November 1, 1956, as the date for said election in said Independence Township, and

WHEREAS, under date of November 1, 1956, an election was duly held in Independence Township at which election a majority of its voters voted to incorporate as a Village, and

WHEREAS, the former Township of Independence is now duly incorporated and functions as the Village of Independence, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the respective Village Councils of Independence and Maple Plain to clarify the status of the above described premises with particular reference to said premises now being within the corporate limits of the Village of Maple Plain and in order to avoid future troubles and disputes from arising between said Villages.

The Council of the Village of Independence ordains:

Section 1. Declaration. It is hereby determined that the territory described below is properly within the corporate limits of the Village of Maple Plain.

Section 2. Territory Annexed. The corporate limits of the Village of Maple Plain were properly extended to include the territory lying and being in the County of Hennepin, State of Minnesota, described as follows, viz:

The South 17½ acres of the Northeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter (NE¼ of SW¼), Section Twenty-four (24), Township One Hundred Eighteen (118), Range Twenty-four (24).

Section 3. Approval. The annexation of the above described property by the Village of Maple Plain, and all proceedings in connection therewith are, and the same is hereby in all respects ratified, confirmed and approved.

Section 4. Filing. The Village Clerk is hereby directed to file certified copies of this Ordinance in the office of the Secretary of State and in the office of the County Auditor of Hennepin County, Minnesota.

Section 5. Effective Date of this Ordinance. This Ordinance shall be complete and effective from and after the date when certified copies of this Ordinance have been filed as described in Section 4.
