A PROCLAMATION FOR CREDIT UNION DAY

WHEREAS, the credit union movement is now in its second century of service; and

WHEREAS, credit unions provide a means whereby people may pool their savings, assisting each other to fill their needs for useful credit at low costs; and

WHEREAS, these credit unions not only promote the economic security of their members, but also exemplify the spirit of true brotherhood, while at the same time encouraging development of individual responsibility; and

WHEREAS, the third Thursday of each October is internationally observed as Credit Union day;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Thursday, October 17, 1957 as


CREDIT UNION DAY
