A Proclamation for Minnesota Constitution Day

WHEREAS, on October 13, 1857 the voters of the State of Minnesota adopted by almost unanimous vote the Constitution prepared by the constitutional conventions held the previous January and

WHEREAS, by this act, the citizens of Minnesota set up the state government of the State of Minnesota and set the stage for the entry of Minnesota into the union in 1858; and

WHEREAS, in 1958, we celebrate the centennial of Minnesota's statehood and the Legislature of 1957 adopted a concurrent resolution naming October 13, 1957 as Minnesota Constitution Day

BE, HEREBY, I, Neville L. Brown, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the day of October 13, 1957 to be

MINNESOTA CONSTITUTION DAY

and urge all Minnesotans to recognize the importance of this day in Minnesota's history and development.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this ninth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven and of the State, the one hundredth.
