WHEREAS, Every effort has been made to arrest the guilty party, but without success, and the public safety requires his capture, conviction and punishment for said offense;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Adolph O. Eberhart, Governor of the State of Minnesota, will cause to be paid out of the treasury of said State the sum of TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200.00) for the arrest and conviction of the perpetrator of said crime, or for such information as will lead to the aforesaid arrest and conviction.
