EXECUTIVE ORDER

1957 No. 8

WHEREAS, Executive Order 1957 No. 1 established the beginning and ending of Daylight Saving Time, pursuant to Laws 1957, chapter 646; and

WHEREAS, a reconsideration of the closing date of Daylight Saving Time has been requested by state legislators and citizens in both urban and rural areas throughout the state and an opinion from the Attorney General of the State of Minnesota, dated August 13, 1957 states that the Governor has the power to make the adjustments necessary in light of the practicable considerations involved;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby alter Executive Order 1957 No. 1 to the end that at 2:00 a.m. on Sunday, September 29, 1957 the standard of time in this state shall revert to the mean solar time of the ninetieth meridian of longitude west of Greenwich, commonly known as Central Standard Time.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twentieth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven and of the state, the one hundredth.
