In the Matter of the Application of George H. Goodspeed for an Order Requiring the Correction by Julius A. Schnahl, as Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota, of the Official Ballots to be used in Submitting Constitutional Amendments at the General Election of 1914.....

PER CURIAM.

The application of George H. Goodspeed for an order requiring this respondent, Secretary of State, to correct the official state ballot containing the proposed Constitutional Amendments to be voted upon at the November, 1914 General Election, having been duly heard and considered and it appearing that error has been made in the preparation of said ballot, it is ORDERED:

That you, the said Julius A. Schnahl, the respondent herein, as Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota, do immediately upon receipt of a copy hereof:

Refrain from further printing, circulating and distributing and furnishing to the proper officials of said state the ballot prepared by you for the submission of the proposed amendments to the Constitution of said state at the General Election to be held in November, 1914.

That you proceed to prepare and make as the official ballot upon which will be submitted the constitutional amendments proposed, a ballot wherein shall be printed the following in reference to the submission of the amendment to Section 2, of Article 4, of the Constitution, to-wit:

"SECTION 2. AMENDMENT OF ARTICLE 4 OF THE CONSTITUTION, RELATING TO THE NUMBER OF MEMBERS OF THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE RULES OF APPOINTMENT THEREOF."
