The application of George H. Goodspeed for an order  
requiring the respondent, Secretary of State, to correct the  
official state ballot containing the proposed Constitutional  
Amendments to be voted upon at the November, 1924 General Elec-  
tion, having been duly found and considered and no errors  
that error has been made in the preparation of said ballot, it  
is ordered:

That you, the said Julian A. Schenck, the respondent  
herein, as Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota, do im-  
mediately upon receipt of a copy hereof:

Refrain from further printing, circulating and distri-  
buting and furnishing to the proper officials of said state the  
ballot prepared by you for the submission of the proposed amend-  
ments to the Constitution of said state at the General Election  
to be held in November 1924.

That you proceed to prepare and make an official  
ballot upon which will be embodied the Constitutional amendments  
proposed, a ballot whereon shall be printed the following in re-  
ference to the submission of the amendment to section 2, of Article  
4, of the Constitution, to wit:

"ARTICLE FOURTH AMENDMENT - SECTION 2 OF AN-  
EXTRA + OF SIX CONSTITUTION, RELATED TO THE RIGHT OF BEARING  
OF THE WEAPON AND WAYS OF PROTECTION AND THE RIGHT OF APPEAL  
IN CRIMINAL CASES."


