A PROCLAMATION FOR BILL OF RIGHTS DAY

WHEREAS, December 15, 1957, marks the 166th anniversary of the adoption of the Bill of Rights - - the first 10 amendments to the Constitution of the United States; and

WHEREAS, the guarantees contained in the Bill of Rights are intended to protect and preserve the civil liberties and personal freedoms of all Americans; and

WHEREAS, it is our right and duty to strive toward the fullest realization of those freedoms for our neighbors as well as for ourselves in our daily lives;

LET, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim December 15, 1957 as

BILL OF RIGHTS DAY


In Minnesota and urge all citizens of the state to foster maintenance of the Bill of Rights.


