WHEREAS, January 5 is the anniversary of George Washington Carver's death in 1940;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim January 5, 1957 as

GEORGE WASHINGTON CARVER DAY

in Minnesota and urge all citizens of the state toward greater realization of the contributions of all races and creeds to life in our country.
