A PROCLAMATION FOR RURAL-CITY WEEK

WHEREAS, the rural and urban populations of the State of Minnesota work together to form a crucial economic interdependency, which operates to the benefit of both groups; and

WHEREAS, because of the importance of this relationship it is necessary that understanding between urban and rural groups be increased; and

WHEREAS, increased contact usually fosters increased understanding; and

WHEREAS, Kiwanis clubs throughout the United States, including Minnesota, are sponsoring the drive for Rural-City Week observance;

I, ORVILLE L. FREEMAN, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim November 22-28, 1957 as

RURAL-CITY WEEK

in Minnesota and urge all citizens, both urban and rural, to realize the importance of maintaining and improving rural-urban relations.
