A PROCLAMATION FOR SCIENCE YOUTH DAY

- WHEREAS, recent events have shown that the scientific position of the United States is being challenged; and
- WHEREAS, the only long-range approach to meeting the need for scientific manpower is the motivation of more young Americans toward careers in science; and
- WHEREAS, the inventive genius of Thomas Alva Edison has advanced the frontiers of science and the welfare of mankind; and
- WHEREAS, in this time of scientific challenge our country's need for men like Edison is great; and
- WHEREAS, February 11, 1958 will be the 111th anniversary of Edison's birth;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim February 11, 1958 as

SCIENCE YOUTH DAY

in Minnesota and urge the people of this state to encourage youth to accept the great challenge of modern science and technology.
