WHEREAS, the year 1958 marks the one hundredth anniversary of statehood;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the year 1958 as

STATEHOOD CENTENNIAL YEAR


and invite the people of this state to participate in its celebration, paying tribute to the past and rededicating themselves to an increasingly glorious future.


