WHEREAS, it is logical that every farm should have an area of trees for production of wood materials and other beneficial uses; and


WHEREAS, every suitable acre of unused land should be dedicated to the growing of trees and tree farming

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ORVILLE L. FREEMAN, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby designate the year of 1958 as


"MINNESOTA TREE FARM YEAR"


