A Proclamation for Open Broadcasting Day

WHEREAS, Open Broadcasting serves great America by providing special Open programs covering the whole world with their broadcasting, which together, furnish news and the latest technology and entertainment and

WHEREAS, Broadcasting stations and networks have recognized the vital importance of open-air radio communication to a nation with a rapidly increasing population and

WHEREAS, Open Broadcasting also serves great America by helping to form a world of the finest programs of entertainment and information available anywhere in the world;

THE, therefore, I, GEORGE L. DREWRY, Governor of the State of Mississippi, do hereby proclaim January 1, 1950, as

OPEN BROADCASTING DAY

and call upon the Government to give recognition to the contribution of radio and television stations and to encourage the broadcasters in carrying the Open Broadcasting community.
