EXECUTIVE DECREE

A Proclamation for Brotherhood Week in Minnesota

- WHEREAS, the annual celebration of Brotherhood Week, to be held February 16 through 23, 1958, is sponsored by the National Conference of Christians and Jews; and
- WHEREAS, the purpose of Brotherhood Week is to symbolize renewed dedication to the ideals of greater tolerance, understanding, friendship, and cooperation among all our citizens, and greater respect for the differences and beliefs of our peoples; and
- WHEREAS, our strength as one nation under God depends on our unity and informed vigilance as a free people; and
- WHEREAS, Brotherhood Week is in the tradition established by our forefathers and enshrined in the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution and deserves the wholehearted cooperation of all the people of Minnesota;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of February 16 - 23, 1958, as

MINNESOTA BROTHERHOOD WEEK

and urge the citizens of Minnesota to observe this week with full awareness of their responsibility to foster that spirit of brotherhood so essential to the progress of our State and our Nation.
