A Proclamation for Brotherhood Week in Minnesota

WHEREAS, the annual celebration of Brotherhood Week, to be held February 16 through 23, 1958, is sponsored by the National Conference of Christians and Jews; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of Brotherhood Week is to symbolize sacred dedication to the ideals of greater tolerance, understanding, friendship, and cooperation among all our citizens, and greater respect for the differences and beliefs of our people; and

WHEREAS, our strength as one nation under God depends on our unity and informed vigilance as a free people; and

WHEREAS, Brotherhood Week is the tradition established by our forefathers and enshrined in the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution and deserves the wholehearted cooperation of all the people of Minnesota;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of February 16 - 23, 1958, as

MINNESOTA BROTHERHOOD WEEK

and urge the citizens of Minnesota to observe this week with full awareness of their responsibility to insure that spirit of brotherhood so essential to the progress of our State and our Nation.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this seventeenth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight and of the state, the one hundredth.
