A Proclamation for "National Music Week in Minnesota"

WHEREAS, music is one of the highest expressions of man's creative ability and, through the stimulation of basic human sensations and experiences, promotes understanding and the brotherhood of all men;

WHEREAS, May 4 - to 11, 1958, inclusive, has been set aside for the thirty-fifth observance of National Music Week throughout the nation; and

WHEREAS, a full week devoted to music brings to our citizens an awareness of the importance of music in daily living, and encourages young performers and composers; and

WHEREAS, city-wide programs in observance of this week are being planned in communities throughout the state to provide more active participation in music by all people and to foster a deeper appreciation of musical talents;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of May 4 to May 11, 1958 as

NATIONAL MUSIC WEEK IN MINNESOTA

and urge that all citizens, both musicians and non-musicians, make music a part of their lives so that their lives may be enriched by its beauty and expression.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-fourth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight and of the state, one two hundred.
