GOMITITEE ON REVISION OF BY-IAVIS
THE MINNESOTA SOCIETY FOR THE PREVENTION OF CRUSTY.

At the Special Meeting of the Minnesota Society for the Prevention of Cruelty, regularly called June 26th, 1913, this motion prevailed:

What a committee of three be appointed to revise the Constitution and By-1avs, make such changes as should be deemed advisable. and report at the next annual meeting."

The President appointed at that time, Louis Nash, St. Paul, Welcome V. Bradley, Minneapolis, and Hrs. J. A. Brow, Fergus Falls, to sit on this committee. A partial report was made at the Annual Meeting, held November $14 \mathrm{th}, 1915$, and the following motion prevailed:

That the committee appointed on revision of the Constitution and By-laws be continned until the next Annual Meeting."

At the Annual Meeting dated, St. Paul, November 9 th, 1914, at 4 P . Th: the following motion prevailed:
"Po continue the committee on revision of Constitution and By-1aws."

The adjourned annual 1 meeting of December Fth, 1914, was called to order by Viee-president, James Nankevill, and the motion prevailed to adjourn the meeting two weeks, same time same hour and place.

At the adjourned ineeting of December 21st, 1914, the fol lowing motion prevailed:
"That the society hereby adopt the enclosed copy of the Bylaws, as the By-laws for the Minnesota Society for the Prevention of

## BY-LAWS OF THE

IITNMEOTA BOCTETY FOR THE PREVEMLION OF CRUELTY. Revised and Adopted $\qquad$ -
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ARTIOLE 1 - NARE.
The name shall continue as now, HININSOMA SOOTHTY POR THE PREVOTMION OF ORUELIT, which is hereinafter designated by the woras "the Society".

ARMTOTE 11-ATMS and OBJEOTS.
The aims and objects of the soeiety are to inculcate and promote humane sentiment, principles and education; to secure and enforce just laws for the Prevention of Cruelty to Ohildren and Animals; and to secure mion of effort in humane work throughout the state.

ARTICIE 111 - MEUBERS.

1. Members shall be composed of seven clasaes; Honorary Members, Goveming Iife Members, Tife Liembers, Governing Members, Annual Members, Branch liembers and Atfiliabed Society Members.
2. All members shall have the right and be entitled to one vote and also shall be eligible to the office of Director.
3. Honorary Members shall be chosen from among persons who have rendered eminent service in the homane ouvse.
4. Governing Iife Members shall pay into the Treasury of the Soclety the sum of two bundred dollars.
5. Life ifembexs shall pay into the Sreasury of the society
one hundred dollars.
6. Governing Members sha 11 pay into the Ireasury of the Society the sum of Thenty-five Dollars per Jear.
7. Ammal Members shall pay into the Treasury of the Noaiety, Five Dollars per year.
8. Branch Hembers shall pay into the treasury of the Sooiety the sum of Two Dolla re per year.
9. Affiliated Society Members are those making annual reporte to this Soci ety, and shall pay into the Treasury of this Society, tie sum of Tive Dolls xs per year.
10. Honey received from Governing Life Members and Iife Members, shall be invested for the bencfit of the soaiety and the income shall be used only for general purposeas
11. Suitable Certificates of Membership shall be provided, and shall be signed by the President and countersigned by the Secretary.

## ARTIOIR IV - ORRICERS.

The officers of the Society shall be a President, Itrst Viee President, Secona Vicempresident, a Secretary and a Treasurer, a Boerd of Directors, and an Brecutive Committee. The number of members of the Board of Directors shall be thirty-three (including Govemor, Superintendent of Puolic instruction, and Attorney General) until hereafter changed. The President, First Vice-Presiaent, Second Viee-President, Secretary and Executive Comittee, shall be elected from the Board of Direotors.

ARTIOTB $V-$ MEETTNGS OF THE SOCIETY.

1. The Annual Meeting of the Society shall be held on the second Monday in November each year in the Gapitol Builaing


#### Abstract

at St. Paul. Notioe in writing of the time of each Annuel Meeting shall be mailed to all members of the Society at least ten days before such meeting. A Special leeting of memibers of the Sontety may be oalled at any time by the President at his own discretion, or upon the written request of two Dircotors, written notice of the time and place of which meeting shall be malled to all members at least ten days before such meeting. 2. At the Annual Heeting or any adjourned meeting thereot, the Directors, for the ensuing year shall be el ected as provided. by these By-Laws. At the Annual Heeting of the year A. D, 1914, the thirty Directors, shall be elected, in the three classes of ten Directors each, one class shall hold office for one year; a second class shall hold office for two years; and the third class shall hold office for three years and all shall hold office until their successors are elected. At each subsequent Annual Meating ten diroctors shall be eleoted to hold oftice for three years, and unifl their successors shall be elected. 3. Any seven nembers having the power to vote hereunder, irrespective of class, sha 11 constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any Annual Adjournea, or Special Meeting of the Society; any two or more of such voting members shall constitute a quorm to adjourn without further notice of any Annual, Adjourned or Special Neeting of the Society to any fixed time and place.


## ARTICIE VI - DUTIES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECRORS.

1. The Board of Directors shall eleot a President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, a Secretary and Treasurer, and they shell also, elect three persons, who, with the President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-Pregident, and Secretary, shall constitute an Executive Committee. These shall hold office fox one year, and until their successons be elected and quslified respectively, unless removed by the Board of Direotors.
2. The Directors, may fill, et any of their aeetings, vacancies, in the Board, or in any of the above offices, oceasioned by death, resigna tion, inability to act, or removal from the State of Uinnesota, on for any other reason.
3. The Directors shall at their discretion, eleat or remove other officexs or agents of the society. They may adopt by-lavs for themselves; they may make rules and orders for the Government of the society and its officers and for the transaction of its business; they may remit the annal or other dues of any member of the Society; they shall, during the ir term of office, have the full and complete management, $c$ ontrol and disposal of the affairs, property and funds of the society, with full power, for the purpose for whi ch it was incoxporated, and transect all business whatsoever, that the Society should do.
4. The Directors shall receive no pay whaever for any serviees rendered as such Directors, and they shall not incur on account of the Society, any debt beyond the funds which shall be actually in the Treasury during their term of office.

ARIICLE VIL- MEETIMGS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS.

1. The Board of Directors shall call their first meating immediately following the Annuel Flection of the Society, at the same place. Notice in writing of tie time and place of any other meeting of the Board of Directors shall be mailed to each nember of the Board at least three days before such meeting.
2. Five Directors shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of Directors. Meetings of the Board of Directors shall also be aalled by the President, or upon the written request of two Directors, at any time.
3. The order of business shall be as follows:
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1. Calling the Roll.
2. Reading of the ininutes.
3. Reports of Committees.
4. Report of treasurex.
5. Report oí Secretary.
6. Communications and resolutions.
7. Unfinished Business.
8. Nerr Business
9. Mlection of Mombers.
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ARTICLE VIII - SEAL.

The coxporate seal of this Society shall be :


Armicise 1 x - Commurrens.
There may be the following standing committees, consisting
of three members each, except the Auditing Comattee, which shall consist of two members, and the Lecture committee, which shall contain at least two members of the Society, appointed by the President, and the President shall act as a consulting member of each committee.

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1. Cominittee on Humne Education.
2. Committee on Branch Societies and Agencies.
3. Comittee on Laws and Legislation.
4. Committee on Finance.
5. Committee on Lectures.
6. Comittee on Eublication.
7. Auditing Committee.
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ARIIGLE X - EXECUTIVE CONMIMTEE.
The Chairman of each standing committee shall be chosen from the members of the Executive Committee, except the Chaiman of the Comittee on Lectures and Auditing Committee. The Eresident may call an Executive Committee meeting at any time and shall call a meeting on the written request of two members of the Executive Committee; a written notice of the time and place of which meeting shall be mailed to each member of the Executive Comittee at least three days before such meeting. The President shell be ex-pfficio chaixman of this committee. The Secretary shall act in the same capaoity for the Committee. The Executive Committee shall act for the Board of Directors when not in Session.

## ARTIOLE XI - INVESTVENTS

The approval of the President and of a majority of of the Comittee on Finance of the Society shall be necessary to all investments of the Society's investment funds; and in any dism position of any property of the Society, except such as shall come to the hands of the hreasurer as hereinafter provided.

## ARTICLE XII - DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

1. President. The President shall preside (or in his absence one of the Vice-Presidents) at all meetings of the Board and of the Society, and of the Executive and Firmnee Committees.
2. Vice-presidents. One of the two Vice-presidents shall, during the absence or disability of the President, act as president.
3. Searetary. The Secretary of the Society shall keep the records of the society, of the Board of Directors, madrexestigs sexterxekwxyxux and of the Brecutive Comittee, performing suoh duties as they may require, and as are usual in such office. He shall also be the custodian of all its property, except such monies as shall come into the hands of the Treasurer.
4. Assistant Secretary. An Assistant Secretary may be appointed by the Board of Directors or by the Executive Committee, who shall act as assistant to the Secretary.
5. Treasurer. The Ireasurer shall be the custodian of all monies of the Sooiety that shall come into his hands; the same shall be paid out upon proper vouchers only upon his written order, countersigned by the President; and all checks, drafts and orders, payable to the order of the Society, shell be indorsed by the Ireasurer for deposit; he shall keep a record of the propexty and investments of the Society; all books, acounts and records in his hands shall be at all tiems open to the thspection of the President and the Executive Committee. In case of the absence or inability of the Treasurer, then any officer of the Society may be designated by the Executive Committee to act in his place during such absence or disebility; and in case of the absence or disability of the President, then the First Vice President is authorized to countersign, as aforesaid, and in case
of the absence or disability of the President and First VicePresident then the Secand Vieo-President shall so countersign such orders.

The Ireasurer shall give such bonds as may be required by the Executive Cominittee, and deposit all monies of the Society in such bank or banks, as the President and the Executive committee may designate.

He shall make a report of the condition of the Mreasury for auditing purposes, on the first day of Novenebr of each year, and also whenever called upon by the Executive Commttee or the President.
6. Executive Officer. The Executive Comitttee shall employ a man to have charge of the affairs of the Society whenever the Executive Committee or Board of Directors are not in session. He shall be under the direct charge and control of the executive committee making such reports and filling such duties in addition to oarrying out the aims and objects of the Society, as the exectutive comittee may suggest. He shall be retained only at the aiscretion of the executive commttee, His title shall be Executive officer of the Society.

ARTICID XIII-GOUNSTL.
The President, with the concurrence of the Executive committee, shall have power to appoint and employ counsel, who shall be the legal advesor, or advisors, of the society and its officers. ARTICIE XIV.-AGENTS.

1. Agents are not authorized to incur any pecuniary obligations
in its behali by their acts or omissions. No agent with such powers Shall be at any time oreated or appointed by any of the society's officers, nox by its Executive Committee.
2. The Special Agents of the Society shall be appointed and cemoved at will, from time to time, by the President, and Freautive Committee. They shall be subject to and governed by such rules and orders as may be prestribed by the President ad Executive Committee, consistent with the By-Iaws.
3. Special Agents shall receive such salary or pecuniary compensation for their service as may, from time to time, be determined by the President, with the concurrence of the Executive Committee, of by the Committee.
4. No Speoial Agent is authoxized to incur any pecuniary liability Whatsoever on the part of the Society, nor is any 111 egal act or ommission on his part to be deemed within the scope of his authority, as such spectal Agent, or as sanetioned by the Society.

ARTICTE XV. - RAPORTS OF ORFTCERS.
At the Annual Meeting of the society in each year, the President Secretary end qreasurer shall present their Annual Reports.

ARTIOIE XVI - AIMERATIONS AND AMBNDUENISS.
These By-Jaws may be altered at any annaal meeting, of a Special Meeting of the Society convened fox such puxpose, provided notice of such alterations, are embodied in the written notice for such meetings, and/the Board of Directors, provided such alterations shall first be proposed in writing at a meeting of the Board of Direators, and entered at length on the minutes, with the name of the Direator proposing the same, and adopted by such Board $4 t$ a subsequent meeting thereof.

fined ${ }^{(1)} 25.00$ and costs. He paid costs of $\$ 200.00$; but refused to pay fine. Oase had boen appoaled, and trial to he had at some time within the next two of three montha in Hastings, 位n. Hotion prevailed that Mr. Nash, Dr. Bailey and Mrs. Foote, be instructed to continue this case, see it through, and draw upon our treasury for necessary expenses.

dotion prevailed to adopt the report of the eommittee.
A general discussion was held, first, in the matter of Dr. Frencis $x$. Rowley's visit to Minnesota. It was brought up
at our annual meeting a year ago, and in canvassing the situation it was felt advisable not to undertake it at that time. A sagegestion was made that we possibly might arrange for his coming sometime early next year. The matter was left to be arranged for, if thought desirable, by the societies of Duluth, St. Paul, and Minneapolis. Second, relative to the matters to be presented. at the coming Legislature. Tue st. Paul Soojety, through the resolutions already recorded, yrged the adoption of two-1aws Which they have been whale to put in force in $S t$. path, and asked that the Committee on Laws and Legislation be appointed at an early date; also the fact of the necessity of joint and persistent action of the Committee on Finance and individual members to secure a proper appropriation for the maintenance of the society. AIl were interested and pledged their support in their different fields.

Again the matter of appointing an agent at South St. Paul was presented. This netter was gone into quite thoroughly and wile no action was taken it was decided tibet if a suitable person could be found to act in this capacity an appointment would be issued.

Motion prevailed that the meeting adjourn tour weeks, to December fth.
