A PROCLAMATION FOR NATIONAL SOCIAL HYGIENE DAY

WHEREAS, family breakdown is among America's most serious social problems and broken homes, delinquency and emotional and mental illness have created a national emergency; and

WHEREAS, while the marriage rate in the United States was the same in 1956 as in 1900, the rate of divorce tripled in the same time -- the delinquency rate from 1940 to 1956 increased fifty percent although the number of children under eighteen rose only five percent; and

WHEREAS, the cherishing, servicing and strengthening of the child and his family is a challenging task for the community with its resources and for the schools with their resources; and


WHEREAS, the fourth Wednesday of April will mark the twenty-second observance of National Social Hygiene Day and will focus community attention on preventing family breakdown through educational and supportive measures,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Wednesday, April 23, 1958 as


MINNESOTA'S SOCIAL HYGIENE DAY
