A PROCLAMATION FOR "CHILD HEALTH DAY IN MINNESOTA"

WHEREAS, a higher standard of living enables more of us to enjoy the benefits of family life; and

WHEREAS, rapid advances in medical science have made childbirth safer; and

WHEREAS, life expectancy at birth has been extended by more than a score in our lifetime;

NOW KNOWING, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim Thursday, May 1, 1958, as

"CHILD HEALTH DAY IN MINNESOTA"

and call upon all public and private agencies and citizens generally to help preserve and protect the health and safety of our future citizens - the children and youth of our Great State, to extend our knowledge in the elimination of those perils still confronting our children, and to encourage and assist them in accomplishment and creativity, education and service, that they might build the broad base so necessary for a happy, healthy, full and vital life in their later years.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-fifth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight and of the state, the one hundredth.
