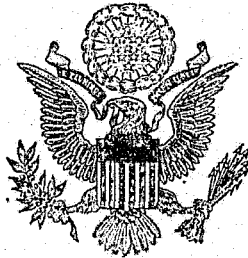

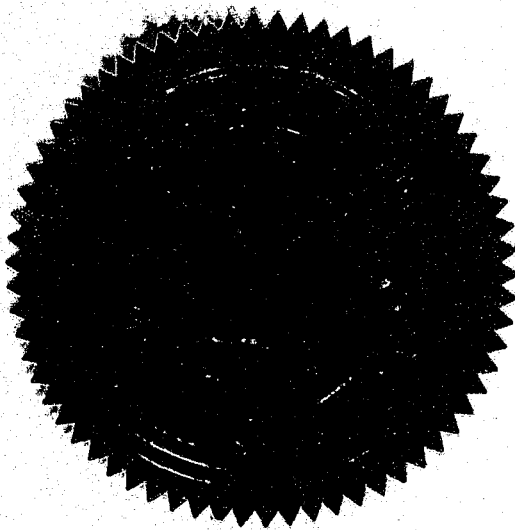

WOODROW WILSON,

PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,

To all whom it may concern:

Satisfactory evidence having been exhibited to me that Edgar Prochnik has been appointed Consul of Austria-Hungary at St. Paul, Minnesota, I do hereby recognize him as such, and declare him free to exercise and enjoy such functions, powers, and privileges as are allowed to the Consuls of the most favored Nations in the United States.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the United States to be hereunto affixed.
