A PROCLAMATION FOR UNION LABOR WEEK IN MINNESOTA

WHEREAS, the men and women who comprise the organized labor movement in this distinctly progressive state contribute in a substantial degree to insure the economic stability and

WHEREAS, it is a well established fact that the purchasing power of a predominant majority of our people in all walks of life has been increased by labor's program for its economic and social advancement; and

WHEREAS, as the direct result of labor's endeavor to obtain for the wage earner a more equitable share of the fruits of their labor, business everywhere has benefited by increased productivity and an expanded market as the result of greater purchasing power among all segments of our population; and

WHEREAS, the purchase of Union labor goods and the patronage of services designated by Shop Cards and Service Buttons is conducive to the maintenance and improvement of a high standard of living and desirable working conditions — standards which tend to insure a healthy economy for all;

I, ORVILLE L. FREEMAN, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the period of September 1 through 7, 1958 as

UNION LABOR WEEK IN MINNESOTA

and call on all citizens to observe the week as a tribute to organized labor by patronizing stores and shops that feature Union Labor, Shop Cards and Service Buttons.
