A PROCLAMATION FOR CANNED FOODS MONTH, 1958

WHEREAS, the year-round availability of high-quality, nutritious canned foods has played a substantial part in making the United States the boot-fed nation in history and in banishing the spectre of hunger from our land by eliminating dependence upon the fickle or fuming caprice of nature; and

WHEREAS, the State of Minnesota plays an important role in growing and processing the canned foods which help provide the people of our own State and of distant parts of the nation with the dietary and health benefits which stem from scientific agriculture and modern processing methods; and

WHEREAS, the canning and associated industries of our own State and our sister-states throughout the nation have this year combined their resources to give concerted emphasis, in September, to the unparalleled output of canned products which our nation makes available to every family in the land, at prices within the reach of all; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of the benefits thus provided to our population by the agricultural, processing and allied industries involved in canning, and by the agencies of transportation, marketing and distribution which bring the bounty of our fields, streams, and offshore fishing areas within the ready reach of homes throughout our nation;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of September, 1958 as


CANNED FOODS MONTH, 1958

and urge the citizens of this State to acquaint themselves with the facilities existing in Minnesota for the canning of fruits, vegetables, and scores of other products, and the low-cost, high-quality products those facilities provide.
