A PROCLAMATION FOR CREDIT UNION DAY

- WHEREAS, the Credit Union Movement is now in its second century of service; and
- WHEREAS, credit unions provide a means whereby people may pool their savings, and mutually assist each other to fill their needs for useful credit at a low cost; and
- WHEREAS, credit unions combat usury, encourage thrift and regular savings; and
- WHEREAS, these credit unions not only promote the economic security of their members, but also strengthen democracy, encourage individual responsibility and the practice of true brotherhood and thus benefit our entire commonwealth; and
- WHEREAS, these benefits have been recognized by the laws of our state under which credit unions are chartered; and
- WHEREAS, the third Thursday of each October is internationally observed as Credit Union Day, in recognition of the outstanding service being rendered to all people by their credit unions;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Thursday, October 16, 1958, as

CREDIT UNION DAY

to be observed in the State of Minnesota and urge our people to give fitting recognition at this time to the many benefits brought to them through credit unions.

AND ON THIS OCCASION, I extend to the leaders and members of Minnesota credit unions my greetings, congratulations, and sincere wishes for continued success in serving their fellowmen.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fourth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight and of the state, the one hundred first.
