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A PROCLAMATION FOR "CITIZENSHIP DAY"

WHEREAS, September 17, 1958 is notable as marking the one hundred seventy-first anniversary of the adoption of the Constitution of the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, the new classes of citizens -- those who have just reached the age of twenty-one and the foreign-born citizens who have received their naturalization papers, should be appropriately welcomed; and

WHEREAS, all citizens of the state should be urged to exercise vigilance in their efforts to maintain the blessings of freedom; and

WHEREAS, to accord official recognition to this memorable anniversary in the State of Minnesota;

I, THOMAS E. Greville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Wednesday, September 17, 1958 as

"CITIZENSHIP DAY"

in Minnesota and urge the citizens of this state to develop a more thorough knowledge of their rights and responsibilities as citizens.
