We, the undersigned, voters residing within the territory and upon the lands situate, lying and being within the County of Morrison, and State of Minnesota, and described as follows, to-wit:

We, the undersigned, do hereby certify that we are two of the inspectors duly appointed by the County Board of Morrison County, Minnesota, and duly qualified, to act as judges of election whereat the proposition of incorporating territory in said county into a village to be known as the Village of Grainville was voted upon; that said election was duly held at the time and place designated in the notice of said election, to-wit: on the 4th day of February, A.D. 1915, between the hours of 9 A.M. and 5 P.M. of said day, in the Warehouse room, Lot 4, Block one (I), New Pierz, Minnesota,

in said territory; that the undersigned and Magnus Rauch, who were duly appointed and qualified inspectors as aforesaid, duly acted as judges of said election; that said election was conducted so far as practicable in accordance with the laws regulating the election of town officers; that only voters residing within the territory petitioned to be incorporated into such village were permitted to vote at such election; that the ballots cast at such election bore the words, "For incorporation ---Yes---No," with a square after each of the last two words in one of which the voter made a cross to express his choice; that immediately upon the closing of the polls said inspectors proceeded to canvass the ballots cast at said election and continued said canvass without interruption until all the ballots cast thereat had been completely canvassed; that the total number of votes cast thereat was 33 of which 16 were cast in favor of such incorporation and 15 were cast against such incorporation, and two ballots did not indicate the intention of the voter either way.
