WHEREAS, the American mother is doing so much for the home and for the moral and spiritual uplift of the people of the United States and house so much for good government and humanity; and


WHEREAS, the American Gold Star Mothers suffered the supreme sacrifice of motherhood in the loss of their sons and daughters in the World War;

"COLD STAR MOTHERS DAY"


