A PROCLAMATION FOR "AMERICAN HISTORY MONTH"

WHEREAS, the history of America reveals the problems, struggles and accomplishments which the people of our country have met; and

WHEREAS, the opportunities and advantages that are ours today are the results of the efforts of our forefathers to build a nation; and

WHEREAS, understanding of past events is essential to solving present problems and dealing successfully with future situations and conditions; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Daughters of the American Revolution are urging greater attention to and emphasis upon American history;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Illinois, do hereby proclaim February, 1958 as

"AMERICAN HISTORY MONTH"

In Illinois and urge all citizens of the state to greater appreciation of the heritage that is ours and to greater awareness of how the lessons of the past can help solve problems of the present and future.
