RESOLUTION calling a special election of the Village of Costin to submit to the electors of said Village the question as to whether or not the incorporation of said Village should be dissolved.

On Motion, Resolved, That whereas a petition signed by a number of legal voters, equal at least to one-third of all legal votes cast at the preceding general election, has been duly presented to this Council^{at} their regular meeting held on the 5th day of January, 1915, asking that the question of dissolving the incorporation of said Village of Costin, be submitted to the vote of the legal electors thereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is ordered that a special election be held for that purpose on Monday, the 18th day of January, 1915, at the Village Hall in said Village of Costin, between the hours of nine o'clock in the forenoon and nine o'clock in the afternoon of the same day, at which election the question of dissolving the incorporation of said Village of Costin will be submitted to the legal voters by ballot, and the ballots shall read as follows:

Frank Gagnon moved the adoption of the above resolution and it was seconded by J. Jackson and declared carried on the following votes:
