A PROCLAMATION FOR INTERNATIONAL LETTER WRITING WEEK

WHEREAS, knowledge of the ways and lives of the other peoples of the world increases understanding among nations; and

WHEREAS, all channels of communication must be utilized to achieve better mutual understandings; and

WHEREAS, contact between individuals by letter is an especially effective means of communication for nations as well;

THE SENATOR, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim the week of October 5 - 11, 1958 as

"INTERNATIONAL LETTER WRITING WEEK"

in Minnesota and urge all citizens of the state to write letters to friends in other nations and thus act as ambassadors of good will among nations.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed this twenty-ninth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight and of the state, the one hundred first.
