Hon. Gorham Powers, one of the Judges of the Twelfth Judicial District of the State of Minnesota was duly elected Judge of said Court on November 3, 1914, his term commencing on the first Monday of January, 1915.

He has this day presented an application in writing for retirement for the unexpired portion of the term for which he was elected in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 269 of the General Laws of Minnesota for 1915, for the reason that he is physically incapacitated from performing his judicial duties during the remainder of his term of office, and in said application dated February 11, 1915, he has set forth the nature and extent of his disability.

Now, upon receipt of the said application and having made an investigation thereof, and being fully advised in the premises, it is hereby determined that said Gorham Powers, one of the Judges of the Twelfth Judicial District of the State of Minnesota, is physically incapacitated from performing his judicial duties for the remainder of the term for which he has been elected; that said Gorham Powers is afflicted with cardiac vascular disease due to senile degeneration; that his illness is permanent; that he will not at any time during his term of office be able to perform his judicial duties, and the public service is suffering.

Now, therefore, I, Winfield S. Hammond, Governor of the State of Minnesota, direct the retirement of said Gordon Powers for the unexpired portion of the term for which said Gordon Powers was elected under the provisions of Chapter 269 of the General Laws of Minnesota for 1915.
