A PROCLAMATION FOR "THANKSGIVING DAY"

WHEREAS, the observance of Thanksgiving Day is one of the noblest of the many fine traditions which the people of the United States owe to the founders who laid the foundation for our republic; and

WHEREAS, every citizen of Minnesota and of the United States of America has reason to be thankful for those great blessings of freedom and abundance with which God has endowed our people and our country; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting that we, as a people enjoying such gifts, should not only give for at least one day's special thanks to our Creator for the material and spiritual values which are ours, but that we should also seek to be worthy of these blessings by efforts to extend them to others not so favored; and

WHEREAS, in this latter season, Minnesota citizens should at this time of year especially, remember and cooperate with the Thanksgiving programs being carried out by the three faiths - The Catholic Bishops Thanksgiving Clothing Collection, The Protestant "Share Our Surplus" Appeal, and the United Jewish Appeal - so that we may bring a part of our blessings to those unfortunate victims of war, famine and disaster the world over;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the day of November 27, 1958 as

"THANKSGIVING DAY"

and urge all men, women and children to give special thanks to God on that day in accord with their own particular religious principles and beliefs.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-seventh day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight and of the state, the one hundred first.
