A PROCLAMATION FOR "BILL OF RIGHTS DAY"

WHEREAS, December 16, 1968, marks the 197th anniversary of the adoption of the Bill of Rights -- the first 10 amendments to the Constitution of the United States; and

WHEREAS, the guarantees contained in the Bill of Rights are intended to protect and preserve the civil liberties and personal freedom of all Americans; and

WHEREAS, it is our right and duty to strive toward the full and application of those freedoms for our neighbors as well as for ourselves in our daily living;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim December 16, 1968 as

BILL OF RIGHTS DAY

In Minnesota and urge all citizens of the state to foster maintenance of the Bill of Rights.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed this twenty-fifth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight, and of the state, the one hundred eighth.
