WHEREAS, through the magic quality of music, people of all races, creeds and colors may understand and appreciate this universal language; and

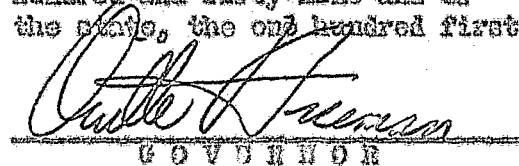
WHEREAS, in focusing public attention on music for this week, more people are learning the benefits and joys to be experienced from participation in music;

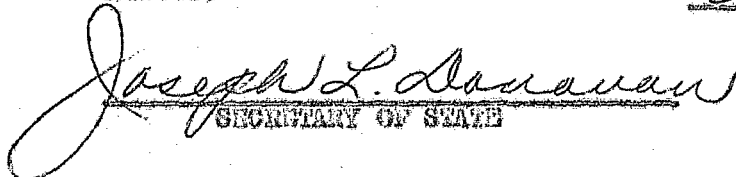
"NATIONAL MUSIC WEEK"

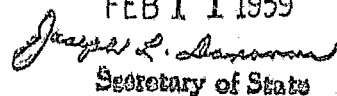
