NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the day of March 17, 1959 as

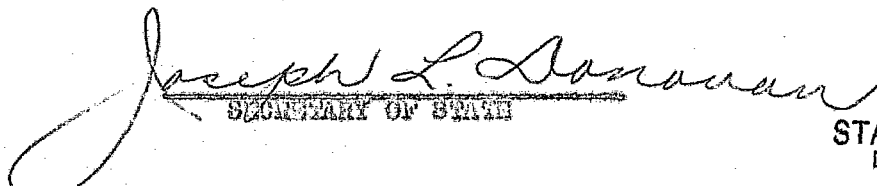
"CAMP FIRE GIRLS FOUNDERS DAY"

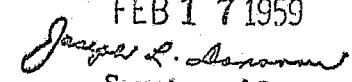
a time for the citizens of this State to unite with the Camp Fire Girls organization in marking another important milestone in its impressive history of service to youth.
