WHEREAS, an intensified nationwide program based on the theme that "It's Fun to be a Fan" has been carried out by the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues; and



I, ORVILLE L. FREEMAN, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 6 - 12, 1959 as


"LET'S ALL PLAY BALL WEEK--IT'S FUN TO BE A FAN"
