A PROCLAMATION FOR "PHYSICAL THERAPY WEEK"

WHEREAS, physical therapy is a medical service devoted to the return of the ill and the handicapped to a constructive life; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota in 1958 had a ratio of one physical therapist for each 26,000 persons and the national average is one per 22,000 population; and

WHEREAS, many of the health needs of the people can be met through the development and utilization of the professional groups allied with physicians in medical care; and

WHEREAS, the American Physical Therapy Association has since 1922 fostered the development and improvement of physical therapy service and physical therapy education, and has made a concerted effort throughout the United States to meet the ever increasing demand for personnel; and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Chapter of the American Physical Therapy Association will be host to the 36th Annual Conference of the Association;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of June 21 through June 26, 1959 as

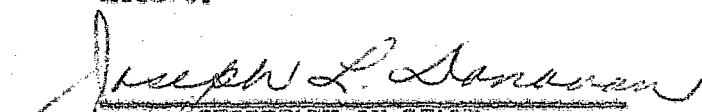

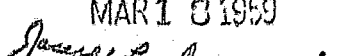
