AN ORDINANCE TO ANNEX CERTAIN PROPERTY TO THE CITY OF WORTHINGTON,  
MINNESOTA.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WORTHINGTON, DO ORDAIN:

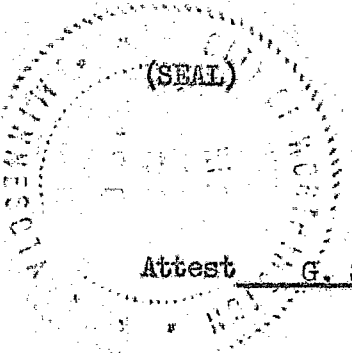
NOW, WHEREAS, Pursuant to Section 413.14 and all amendments there to,  
of Minnesota Statutes for 1941, all owners of property hereinafter described  
and abutting upon the City of Worthington, have petitioned the City Council  
of said City of Worthington to have such property annexed to said City; and

WHEREAS, It is desired that said territory become a part of said City  
of Worthington, the same as if it had been originally a part thereof;

NOW, THEREFORE, The following described territory is hereby declared  
to be a part of the City of Worthington; to-wit,

Lots One (1) to Twenty-two (22), inclusive, in Block Nine (9), Lots  
One (1) to Eleven (11), inclusive, in Block Fourteen (14); and Street Lots  
A, B, and C, in Auditor's Plat of Blocks Nine(9) and Fourteen (14), Ludlow  
Acres, in part of Government Lot Two (2), Section 27, Township 102 North,  
Range 40 West, Nobles County Minnesota.
