

A PROCLAMATION FOR "CLEAN-UP WEEK IN MINNESOTA"

WHEREAS, the abrupt emergence of springtime in Minnesota traditionally brings forth a sudden surge of refreshed and renewed vigor; and

WHEREAS, men, women and children everywhere in our state experience a revived enthusiasm for the natural beauty of our state; and

WHEREAS, at no other time of the year is it more important that we strive to rid our communities of the drab and the offensive, the unhealthy and the hazardous, so that we and our many vacationing guests may enjoy to the fullest the exceptional beauty for which our state is known.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 20 through April 25, 1959 as

"CLEAN-UP WEEK IN MINNESOTA"

and urge all public and private agencies and citizens generally to help improve and maintain the health, safety and appearance of our communities; to approach this job in a safe, systematic and sensible manner; and to support all programs designed to eliminate those health and safety problems which still confront us, particularly with regard to fire in this exceptionally dry season.
