

A PROCLAMATION FOR "HARRY S. TRUMAN DAY"

WHEREAS, the Honorable Harry S. Truman will round out his third quarter-century on the eighth day of May, nineteen hundred and fifty-nine; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Truman served his fellow countrymen faithfully and well as Captain of Artillery, as County Judge, as United States Senator, as Vice President of the United States, and as President of the United States; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Truman's momentous and far-sighted decisions as Chief Executive in an era of great stress have secured him an enduring place in the history of this country and of the world; and

WHEREAS, in retirement he continues to devote his thoughts and energies to the good of our country and of its friends and allies; and

WHEREAS, the respect and esteem with which his accomplishments as a statesman are regarded by his fellow citizens are matched by the warm affection in which they hold him as a person;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Friday, the eighth of May, nineteen hundred and fifty-nine, as

"HARRY S. TRUMAN DAY"

and urge all citizens of the State of Minnesota to make suitable observance of this seventy-fifth anniversary of the birth of a great and beloved American.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-fourth day of April in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and fifty-nine and of the state, the one hundred first.
