
A PROCLAMATION FOR "NATIONAL BARBER WEEK"

WHEREAS, it is fitting that barbers be given appropriate recognition;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, CIVILIS L. FREEMAN, Governor of the State of

September 19, 1959 as


"NATIONAL BARBER WEEK"
