A PROCLAMATION FOR "CONSTITUTION WEEK"

WHEREAS, September 17, 1959, marks the one hundred seventy second anniversary of the adoption of the Constitution of the United States of America by the Constitutional Convention; and

WHEREAS, the Constitution is the basis of our government and the guarantor of the rights of citizens in a democracy to our people; and

WHEREAS, Public Law No. 915 provides for the issuance of a proclamation by the President of the United States designating September 17 through September 25 of each year as Constitution Week;

I, CHESTER W. WILSON, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of September 17 - 25, 1959

"CONSTITUTION WEEK"

and urge all Minnesotans to give particular attention during that week to the Federal Constitution and the advantages of American citizenship which it accords.
