PROCLAMATION

Youth Honor Day

WHEREAS, the vast majority of the youth of this state are law abiding citizens who have displayed high standards of character, integrity and patriotism and have distinguished themselves in their readiness to defend and uphold the principles upon which this nation is founded, and

WHEREAS, despite these high achievements, a small minority of juveniles, who have been delinquent and delinquent, caused undue public criticism on the youth as a whole to the degradation of those who are the true deserving of public criticism, and

WHEREAS, a fitting tribute should be paid to those youth who have been overlooked in matters of recognition because of the wrongs of a few that have overshadowed the more far reaching accomplishments of the many, and,

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the state of Minnesota by resolution has authorized and requested the Governor of the State to take appropriate action to call the public attention to those youth of Minnesota who properly merit high praise and warm commendation,

BE IT THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the state of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, October 31, 1959, as

YOUTH HONOR DAY

inviting the people of Minnesota to observe the day with appropriate ceremonies.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the state of Minnesota to be affixed at the state capitol this twenty-third day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine, end of the state, the one hundred second.
