

MOTOR BUS RECIPROCITY CONTRACT

This agreement made and entered into by and between the State of Minnesota and the State of Missouri, through their respective duly authorized representatives, and to the extent permitted by the law of each of said States:

WITNESSETH: In consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter contained, it is agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

All persons, firms, partnerships, and corporations owning or operating motor buses in the transportation of persons for hire in interstate commerce, and interstate and intrastate commerce incidental thereto, between and in the States may engage in such operations provided the owner or operator of the motor buses has complied fully with Minnesota Statutes, Section 168.61 through 168.65, and the applicable motor vehicle registration laws (or apportionment formula) of the State of Missouri.

Each of the buses so operated shall either display a license plate of the State in which the vehicle is registered, or a distinctive identification issued by such State indicating that such motor bus has been granted reciprocal privileges.

Nothing in this agreement shall be construed to permit the operation of motor buses upon the highways of the several States in excess of the maximum weight, length, or height allowed by the law of the State in which such vehicles shall be operating, or contrary to any provisions of law, safety rules and regulations.

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Nothing in this agreement shall be construed as a waiver of the requirements of the state regulatory bodies of either of the States.

Nothing in this agreement shall be construed as a waiver of the requirements of either of the reciprocating States with respect to gasoline and other fuel tax.

Each of the reciprocating States reserves the right to withdraw reciprocal immunity as to any owner or operator for just cause.

The operator of any vehicle for which reciprocal privileges are claimed must have in his possession a valid and legal registration certificate or other evidence of proper registration issued for such vehicle by the State or other jurisdiction in which it is registered.

It is agreed that the immunity and reciprocal privileges offered by either of the States, parties hereto, shall be contingent upon the granting of substantially like immunities and privileges by the other reciprocating State.

This agreement concerning motor buses shall continue in full force and effect until terminated by thirty (30) days written notice from any one State to the other, party hereto, subject always to statutory alterations and such as may result from further negotiations.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, duly authorized officials of the States, parties hereto and heretofore named, have hereto set their hand and seal on the 8th day of September, 1959.
